Peace

- In the Old Testament, the word for peace is *shalom*
- It was a normal greeting for among Jewish people
- Shalom means a blessing for completeness, for contentment, fulfillment, satisfaction, prosperity on all levels of life
- In the New testament, peace is the eirene, where we get the female name Irene
- Eirene (peace) means to bind together, to join, to weave or braid together
- It means regardless of what is going on in life, nothing can cause the peace we have with God to unravel

Peace, I Leave with You (the Legacy of Peace) John 14:27 (KJV) ²⁷ "Peace I leave with you ..."

- In John 13, Jesus shared with the disciples some very upsetting news
- Jesus said
 - o one of disciples would betray Him
 - Another one would deny Him
 - o And on top of all of that, He would no longer be with them
- For the disciples, it was time of sorrow, confusion, and a time of departure and separation
- The disciples were greatly troubled, disturbed, agitated, perplexed, worried, tossed about, confused, and distressed.
- The disciples were anxious about the future; just like many of us
- The disciples needed to be settled down and given some sense of peace: to receive some encouragement and some new hope.
- For times like these, Jesus says "Peace I leave with you..."
- I made plans for you to help you make it after I'm gone, I put you in My will
- I'm leaving you a *legacy* of peace, an *inheritance* of peace
- Jesus is saying peace is in His will for you
- The peace Jesus leaves us is not affected by the circumstances of life, but it
 has an effect on the circumstances of life
- Jesus' peace is not natural, it's supernatural
- It's a level of peace that can be attained in spite of the circumstances you're going through
- It is a peace that lives above our circumstances.
- Even though we might not understand how Jesus' peace works, we have a peace
- The peace of God is going to prevent the thoughts of confusion, worry, doubt; that try to gain access, to upset, trouble, or contaminate your mind
- You have a legacy of peace

My Peace I Give to You (the Gift of Peace)

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"...my peace I give unto you:..."

- Where does this peace come from?
- The source this peace is Jesus Christ Himself
- You can't find or receive this peace from anywhere else
- Jesus' Peace is supernatural and Spirit-given Galatians 5:22-23 (KJV) 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, 23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.
- Jesus' peace is like a deep underground well, constant and unaffected by weather; while our "self-made peace" is like a "puddle", shallow and evaporates quickly under pressure
- When Jesus says "My peace I give you", it is His gift to you,
- Jesus gives us His peace; not something borrowed, but something borne out of His divine nature
- It is the peace He *used* in His own life
- The peace Jesus gives is *battle-tested* peace
- This peace worked for Jesus and that's why He wants to give it to you
- The peace Jesus gives is:
 - A tranquility of mind, a composure, a peace that is calm in the face of difficult circumstances and situations.
 - A peace of unquestioned confidence; the peace with a sure knowledge that your life is in the hands of God
 - It's the peace of intimacy with God
 - It is the peace that settles the mind, strengthens the will, and establishes the heart.
- The peace Jesus gives is always born out of relationship.
- This peace is a product of our relationship with Jesus Christ. "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1).
- Jesus gives the disciples and us, a gift we didn't even know we needed, His
 peace

Jesus' Peace is Different from the World "...not as the world giveth, give I unto you..."

- The peace Jesus gives to us is completely different from the peace the world has to offer
- The world's peace is *temporary*; it doesn't last
- The world's peace is superficial, it only gives the "appearance" of peace, but doesn't address the core of our problems
- The world's peace is artificial, phony, and fake
- The world's peace is *fragile*, it is quickly and easily broken

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- The world only offers "substitutes" for peace like drugs alcohol, busyness, materialism, etc.
- This isn't real peace, it's an escape
- Escapism is like covering a leaky roof with a tarp, the "substitute" holds for "a while", but the storm *still* gets in
- Jesus' peace is not the "absence" of problems, it's the presence of God in the midst of them

Receive and Apply God's Peace to Your Life

"...Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

- John begins John 14 with "Let not your heart be troubled", and says here near the end of the chapter, "Let not your heart be troubled"
- But in between, Jesus says, "I give you peace"
- What Jesus is saying is the peace He gives must be received and applied to our lives
- When your thoughts and emotions get agitated and stirred up, apply His peace
- When fear comes to try and distract you, dominate and paralyze you, apply His peace to your situation
- Jesus' gives us peace to face life with boldness, not to hide from it
- How do we apply Jesus' peace to our lives?
- We apply Jesus' peace by having faith in Him John 14:1 (KJV) 1 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.
- Jesus' peace will:
 - Strengthen you Psalm 29:11 (KJV) 11 The LORD will give strength unto his people; the LORD will bless his people with peace.
 - Comfort you 2 Corinthians 1:4 (KJV) 4 Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.
 - Help you rise above life's difficulties and problems 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 (KJV) 8 "We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; 9 Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed; ..."
 - Hold you together the word "peace' here means to "weave or bind together"
 - Give you victory "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).
